Welcome and introductions	
Margaret welcomed everyone to the meeting, including new PPG member, Joanna Murphy; Kim Gallagher, our guest speaker; and three members of the Patient <b>Email Group who attended for Kim's presentation.</b>	
Presentation about Wellbeing Swanage - Kim Gallagher, Chair of Swanage Town and Community Partnership and Secretary of Swanage and Purbeck Development Trust	
Margaret welcomed Kim to the meeting and reminded everyone that, at the previous PPG meeting, it had been agreed to invite Kim to update us on the exciting news about Wellbeing Swanage (see Special Update April 2023 at: <u>https://www.sandpdt.org.uk/wp-content/uploads/2023/04/SPDT-SAF-Newsletter-2304-Special-Bulletin.pdf</u> ). Kim had last attended a PPG meeting in January 2021, when Wellbeing Swanage was first being set up.	
Kim explained that the Swanage and Purbeck Development Trust (SPDT) had been set up to enable gaps in local priorities to be addressed. Their first project had been to take over the building previously used by the Swanage Youth Club. After internal refurbishment, The Centre opened in April 2017 and is now an established Community Hub, providing wrap-around childcare for children aged 0- 11 years as well as a rejuvenated Youth Club. The building also provides a community space that is used by other organisations.	
Several years ago, the SPDT asked if they could also take over the buildings in Chapel Lane adjacent The Centre, if they became available - the plan being to develop a Wellbeing Hub as part of a wider project called Wellbeing Swanage, inspired by The Frome Model (see: <u>https://compassionate-</u> <u>communitiesuk.co.uk/2021/11/28/the-frome-model/</u> ). In March 2023, Dorset Council Cabinet confirmed that the Day Centre and Children's Centre would be transferred to the SPDT. It is hoped that the formalities will be completed within the next couple of months.	

	The plan is to create a Health and Wellbeing Hub with a Welcome Lounge, where people can ask about what help is available locally, and a Community Café. It will also provide space from which a wide range of services can be delivered. The Hub will be part of a network of Family Hubs across Dorset, offering one-stop services for families.	
	Although progress on this project was delayed by the Pandemic, good progress has already been made on setting up a directory of local community and voluntary organisations (see: <u>https://wellbeingswanage.org</u> ). Work is currently underway to develop a new website, which will also include a wide range of useful resources.	
	Wellbeing Swanage also offers Community Connector Training - so far, 55 Community Connectors have been recruited and Wellbeing Swanage now plans to start actively recruiting again.	
	Margaret thanked Kim for attending the meeting.	
	It was agreed that the PPG would actively promote Wellbeing Swanage - and the new website when this is launched.	PPG
	Natasha agreed to liaise with Kim regarding the provision of Community Connector Training for the receptionists at the Surgery.	NR

	We were pleased to hear that Dr Gavins had decided to join the Practice, after completing her GP training - she will be providing six sessions / week from	
	September 2023. Dr Beth Law returned from maternity leave in May. Dr Stone is working with Dr McIntosh as his Registrar. Sarah Cunningham, who is a Physician Associate, has also recently started working at the Practice - Physician Associates (PAs) are generalist healthcare professionals, who work alongside doctors as part of a multidisciplinary team. She is being supported by Dr Qureshi. The Clinical Team also includes four Advanced Clinical Practitioners, all of whom have undertaken additional training to enable them to fulfil these roles. Natasha also confirmed that the receptionists are all trained Care Navigators - they receive ongoing training and support from Dr Heard.
